CONVENTION ON THE MOVEMENTS OF  
LIBERIAN AND MAURITANIAN CITIZENS  
BETWEEN THEIR TWO COUNTRIES

The President of the Republic of Liberia and the President of the Islamic Republic of Mauritania, in an effort to further cement the cordial relations existing between their Countries and Peoples, have decided to implement their desire for closer cooperation by concluding this Convention exempting holders of certain categories of Liberian and Mauritanian passports from visa requirements:

Article I

All holders of Liberian diplomatic and official passports shall be allowed to enter the Islamic Republic of Mauritania without visa or any other entry requirements as long as their travel documents are valid.

Article II

All holders of Mauritanian diplomatic and official passports shall be allowed to enter the Republic of Liberia without visa or any other entry requirements as long as their travel documents are valid.

Article III

Holders of other valid Liberian and Mauritanian travel documents will be allowed to enter the other's Country without visas provided their stay in that Country is not more than ninety (90) days.



Article IV

This Convention shall be subject to ratification in accordance with the constitutional provisions of Liberia and Mauritania and shall come into force upon the exchange of such Instruments of Ratification in Monrovia.


Article V

This Convention shall remain in force for five years after the exchange of the Instruments of Ratification. Thereafter, it may be renewed, modified or extended at the request of either Party.


Article VI
